He has worked extensively on representations of poverty and health in India and the UK using ethnographic and other qualitative methods in the last decade. Some of his works include how risk and trust are manufactured locally in a poor Indian village with regards to people's choice of healthcare (Chauhan & Campbell, 2021). In the same village his work also looked at the local perspectives of poverty in India (Chauhan, 2016) and how cultural memory and local interpretations underpinned the reception of social policies (Chauhan, 2015). Furthermore, he has also explored how traditional knowledge and systemic inequities influence perspectives on mental health in the Chinese society (Lu, Chauhan & Campbell, 2015).
