## Bio:

Lixian Cui is an Associate Professor of Psychology at NYU Shanghai. Lixian received a BS in Psychology from Southwest Normal University, a MS in Applied Psychology from Sun Yat-sen University, and a PhD in Human Development and Family Science from Oklahoma State University.

Lixian's research focuses on child and adolescent social and emotional development in various contexts, particularly emotion socialization in family, school, peer, and cultural contexts. He has conducted emotion-related parenting research in the United States and China, focusing on how parents or family environment facilitate children and adolescents' learning about emotion regulation, and protect children and adolescents from developing internalizing and externalizing problems. Lixian has also extended to investigate teacher's role and peer's role in child development of emotion regulation. He is particularly interested in child and adolescent development in specific cultural contexts. For example, Lixian is now investigating culture specific parental emotion socialization strategies in China, drawing insights from Chinese traditional culture.
