

I am an Associate Professor at the Graduate School of Education and the Global Education Office at Kyoto University, Japan. I received my PhD in Psychological Sciences from the University of Melbourne in 2011, following studies at Korea University, the University of Melbourne, and West Virginia University. I subsequently completed a JSPS Postdoctoral Fellowship at the University of Tokyo.

My research lies at the intersection of cultural, social, and environmental psychology. I investigate how culture shapes the self, well-being, interpersonal relationships, environmental attitudes, and social cognition, with a particular focus on East Asian societies. My work combines cultural psychological theory with large-scale cross-cultural research to better understand both universal and culturally specific aspects of human behavior. Recent projects examine environmental sustainability, climate change psychology, subjective well-being, social inequality, acculturation, and cultural diversity, while also seeking to advance psychological science beyond WEIRD populations through new theoretical perspectives from East Asia.

I have served as principal investigator and co-investigator on projects funded by the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science (JSPS), the Academy of Korean Studies, and Kyoto University. My research has appeared in leading international journals, including *Nature Climate Change*, *Nature Sustainability*, *Perspectives on Psychological Science*, *Psychological Science*, *Journal of Environmental Psychology*, *Journal of Happiness Studies*, *Journal of Cross-Cultural Psychology*, *International Journal of Intercultural Relations*, *Asian Journal of Social Psychology*, and *Personality and Individual Differences*. I have also contributed book chapters to Oxford University Press, Routledge, and Elsevier, and recently translated Shinobu Kitayama's book on cultural psychology into Korean.

I currently serve as an Associate Editor for *Personality and Individual Differences*, *Psychologia*, and *Social Psychological Bulletin*, and previously served as Associate Editor for *Scientific Reports* and the *Korean Journal of Personality and Social Psychology*. I am the elected East Asian Regional Representative of the International Association for Cross-Cultural Psychology (IACCP) and serve on the International Committee of the Japanese Psychological Association.

Before joining Kyoto University, I was Professor at NUCB Business School, where I received multiple Outstanding Research Awards and Teaching Awards. I teach courses on cultural psychology, social psychology, data science, and research methods in both Japanese and English. Through my research and teaching, I aim to promote culturally inclusive psychological science and foster international collaboration in understanding human behavior across diverse cultural contexts.
