#### **Brief Introduction**

Before joining CASS (Chinese Academy of Social Sciences) in 1992, I had taught at an university in Beijing as a lecturer of Economics. In 1986, inspired by my interest in social psychology, I entered the department of psychology in Beijing Normal University and got my Mater degree. In 1988, I began to follow Dr. Chungfang Yang (杨中芳) to learn how to study Chinese people from the perspective of indigenous psychology. Since then, I have been trained in summer school (the teachers are from Taiwan and Hong Kong, Yang K.S., Hwang K.K. Yang, C. F. etc.) for my research focus on Chines indigenous psychology, such as Guanxi (关系, interpersonal relations in Chinese culture), Zijiren (自己人, insider), Bao (根, repay, reciprocity), and coping with social change in contemporary China. I worked in several fields of investigation in basic and applied social psychology, including interpersonal relationship in context of Chinese culture, cultural mixing in globalization, cultural self-constural and oral-history.

I has actively contributed to the academic community through my chief editorial roles in *Chinese Social Psychological Review* (journal) for 20 years which focus on Chinese cultural social psychology. I also served Chinese Association of Social Psychology as president from 2010 to 2014. From 2007 to 2015, I have collaborated with Professor Chiu Chi-yue and Hong Ying-yi to development training to social psychologists in Mainland China.
